There have been a number of reports recently of a Big Green Ben Nicolson Truck. [Ed.] I have been advised by Ben Nicholson, that the truck replaces similar trips by contractors' vehicles for transport of timber, wood chip and equipment, the same drive vehicle with different body attachments. There has been no increase in the number of vehicle movements. There have been comments on the conduct of the driver. Ben Nicholson advises that in response to these comments the vehicle is now only driven by himself or a member of his family.

THE LAST SUPPER



The Shamley Green Conservative branch has ceased to exist because under the recent local government reorganisation the number of wards in the Waverley Borough Council area has been reduced. The Shamley Green ward has ceased to exist and we are now part of the new Bramley and Wonersh ward. Local party branches are based on wards and so the local Conservative branch so far as the village is concerned is now Bramley and Wonersh. The Committee marked their retirement with a supper in the Bricklayers. Chris Sprague, Chair of the Committee was unfortunately absent following a fall on Guildford railway station, warranting a visit to check out the services at the Royal Surrey A & E Department.

GOOSE GREEN - WHERE ARE OUR DUCKLINGS?



We have allowed the Canada and Egyptian Geese to take over the Duck Pond Green, if this is not tackled we will have to refer to it as "Goose Green". There are no longer any ducklings on the duck pond. It would appear that there was too much activity for the mother duck to be able to shepherd her 15 ducklings to teach them and prevent them from straying. I encountered one duckling on the road at the end of Woodhill Lane by the Guildford Road. I assisted mother duck in shepherding it onto the Green. The village sign suggests an association of the community, not only with cricket; but also ducks, albeit that some assumed the association with ducks referred to the cricket club performance. I think our objective should be to manage the pond as a safe haven for mallard ducks and their progeny.



Leadership and direction is expected to come from the Environment Group. However as they are managing the natural asset on behalf of the community, I suggest on such a matter the Environment

Group should convene a meeting, which any interested resident can attend, for discussion and conclusion; or at least widely solicit comment from the community before reaching a conclusion.
