As a result of the Local Authority Ward Boundary Changes in 2023, the objective of which was to even out disparities between the number of councillors and the number of households that they represented, Shamley Green is no longer a single member ward; but is part of the ward of Bramley and Wonersh. The ward is entitled to three councillors. As a result of the Borough elections last year we have three (Conservative) Councillors, Lauren Atkins, Jane Austin and Michael Goodridge. Michael Goodridge has particular responsibility for Shamley Green, Wonersh & Blackheath.
